4. Open Meeting Law Violation Complaint

Sharon Harkay said this is in response to an accusation by Nick Clark that the Open Meeting Law was violated on February 7th by not having a Zoom link. Sharon said 2 different attorneys were consulted, Brian Monahan and Garrett Baxter. Both attorneys assured that the Open Meeting Law was not violated, and since no violation occurred, not cure is necessary. Sharon said she thought the confusion came because people had become accustomed to us having hybrid meetings. When they didn't find the link for that meeting, Nick and a few others felt it was a violation. Sharon said to be clear, it was a bad decision on her part and although it was not illegal, she really misjudged the fact that people would be interested in such a meeting with such a short agenda. Sharon said she wrongly assumed that people wouldn't be interested and had in her mind the Selectboard Assistant would be able to have the night off. In retrospect, it was a bad assumption and a bad decision, and Sharon said she owned that decision. We in no way intended to transition the meetings to without a hybrid option, as we have been doing it all along and intent was to continue. She thought for that one meeting it wouldn't be a problem. Sharon publicly apologized for the confusion and upset, but they did not break the Open Meeting Law. People could have come in person or called in using a phone. No one was prevented from coming or participating. Nick Clark said the town doesn't have adequate equipment for a conference call which is why

the equipment was purchased for Zoom, and if it did there was still no phone number that was provided so I could not access the meeting and no option was offered when I asked for one.

- 1 Sharon said she was under the impression we were able to do conference calls. We have done it
- 2 in the past. Sharon said she had been out cross-country skiing and she returned to all this upset. It
- 3 did not occur to her to offer the option of calling in.
- 4 Nick said that's never been an option and I've used that option.
- 5 Sharon said in any case she apologizes but we did not violate Open Meeting Law.
- 6 Melissa Krzal said Nick put in his letter that Seve said that "you are not required to be here, you
- 7 can leave." Is this true?
- 8 Steve said absolutely. He missed over 20 meetings last year, why wouldn't he know that he was
- 9 not required to be here.
- Melissa said she was really floored that another Selectboard member would say that to another
- person on the board. This seems so out of place for you. I know that he hasn't been at other
- meetings and that there is a lot of animosity on this board, but to come out and say it at a
- meeting? You might privately speak to him and say something like that, but you're dissing
- another board member? Melissa said civility was a big thing to her, and with boards before this
- one there was humiliation and things used against other board members. This is in that vein and
- 16 I'm shocked.
- 17 Steve said to put it in context Nick was saying he was required to be here, and I didn't suggest to
- 18 him that he should leave, just that he is not compelled to be here.
- 19 Sharon said she assumed Steve meant that Nick not required to be physically in the building.
- Again, the idea that he could have gone to his home and called into us.
- 21 Melissa said she just felt, because of how she feels about civility, and how people treat each
- other, that it was an inappropriate comment. It falls right into other boards before you where the
- chair would humiliate and try to get people to his way. Melissa said she is sorry that she had to
- say it because it doesn't seem like you. This board has been very civil publicly to each other. I
- don't know about privately. But this was so out of the blue and out of context, and I think it was
- 26 inappropriate.
 - Sharon thanked Melissa for speaking up and acknowledged that they are hearing her.
